Hope is not a result of the absence of conflict, difficulty, struggle, or trial. Hope is a result of the presence of God.

GOD'S PRESENCE HAS COME TO GIVE US HOPE.


So why do we read Isaiah's prophecy each year during Christmas? It is because seeing the faithfulness of God in the past gives up deep and abiding hope in the present and unwavering trust for the future. The apostle Paul made an appeal for hope to those who trust in Christ as he wrote a letter to the early church in Rome.

"For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope" (Romans 15:4).
